I, THOMAS PITTORINO, of Newton, in the County of Middlesex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills and other testamentary instruments at any time heretofore by me made.

ARTICLE FIRST: I direct the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses and all the expenses of administering my estate.

ARTICLE SECOND: In the event that my daughter, Angelina M. Mandile, is living at my death, I give and devise to her any and all real estate which is situated in Italy and which is then owned by me, and any and all interests then owned by me in any real estate so situated, and, in the aforesaid event, I give and bequeath to her any and all tangible personal property which is then physically located in Italy and which is then owned by me, and any and all interests then owned by me in any tangible personal property so located.

ARTICLE THIRD: All the rest, residue and remainder of my property and estate, both real and personal, of whatsoever nature and wherever situated, of which at my death I am seized or possessed, or over which I then have any right or power of disposition or testamentary control, or to which I may then in any way be entitled, either at law or in equity, in the present or future, I give, devise, bequeath and appoint

as follows: (1) To my wife, Maria Pittorino, if she is living at my death, or (2) if my said wife is not then living but my said daughter, Angelina M. Mandile, is then living, to her, or (3) if my said daughter also is not then living but issue of hers is then living, to such issue then living, such issue to take by right of representation.

ARTICLE FOURTH: Notwithstanding anything to the contrary hereinbefore in this my will contained, I direct that if any person or persons hereinbefore named or described as legatees or devisees under this my will shall die within thirty (30) days after my death, the foregoing provisions of this my will shall take effect in all respects as if each such person so dying within thirty (30) days after my death had predeceased me.

ARTICLE FIFTH: I nominate and appoint my said wife, Maria Pittorino, to be the executrix of this my will and request and direct that she shall be exempt from furnishing any bond as such executrix, or, if required by law to furnish bond, that the amount thereof shall be fixed at the minimum required by law and that as far as permitted by law she shall be exempt from furnishing any surety or sureties thereon or security for the performance thereof.

ARTICLE SIXTH: In addition to, and not in limitation of, her common law and statutory powers, I hereby authorize the executrix of this my will at any time or from time to time to sell the whole or any part or parts of my estate, real or

personal, at public or private sale, for cash or on credit, and upon such terms and for such considerations as she shall deem proper, all without applying to any court for leave to do so, and to transfer or convey the same to the purchaser or purchasers thereof by good and sufficient deeds or other instruments of transfer, free from all trusts, no such purchaser to be responsible for the application of the purchase money.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I, said THOMAS PITTORINO, hereunto set my hand and seal at Boston, Massachusetts, and publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, in the presence of the undersigning three witnesses, whom I have requested to subscribe this will as witnesses thereof, all on this 15th day of March, 1947.

On this 15th day of March, 1947, at Boston, Massachusetts, the above-named testator, THOMAS PITTORINO, signed the foregoing instrument in our presence, declaring it to be his last will and testament, and as witnesses thereof we three do now at his request, in his presence and in the presence of each other, hereto subscribe our names, and at said time said testator appeared to us to be of sound and disposing mind.
